### At home assignments will include:

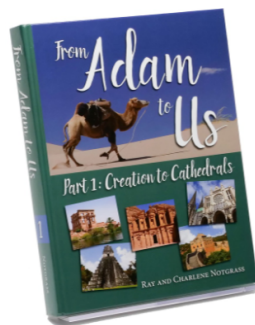
- Three weekly readings from the textbook, *From Adam to Us : Creation to Cathedrals*

**Tuition:** \$50.00 per month

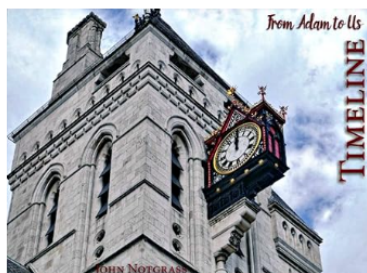
**Class Fee:** One time \$20.00 fee for the year
