Course Description

Where to Get Books

- **Free options:** Check your local library (OKC, Edmond, etc.) through the **Libby app** for e-books and audiobooks (highly recommended for convenience). Many of these titles are available as free digital loans.
- Other sources: Amazon (new/used), ThriftBooks, or homeschool resale groups. Audiobooks are excellent for car rides or busy evenings.

Supplies Needed

- 1–1.5 inch binder
- Notebook paper or composition notebook
- Pencils, erasers, and colored pencils or markers
- Glue stick and scissors
- Folder for loose papers

At Home Work

- **This class is designed in 2-week segments.** This means we read/discuss a book and its historical events for 2-weeks, and then focus on in-class activities for 2-weeks.
- **Book weeks** (2 weeks per book): Students will read the assigned book at home (typically 20ish minutes per night, depending on the book). We will discuss the reading and related American history topics during our in-person class.
- **Activity weeks** (no new book): Students will complete simple crafts - either at home, or in class (depending on week), in class recipes, map work, or review from the previous book.

Assignments / Projects

- **Weekly Assignments:** Students will complete a simple worksheet provided for each book (short answers, vocabulary, or reflection questions).
- **Projects:** There will be two at-home projects per semester that students will present in class - these will serve as the tests for each semester. More information about these will be given in class and sent home.
