Course Description: This course will deepen students' understanding and appreciation of music by listening to and covering the greatest pieces in the canon of Western classical music within their historical context. In the latter part of the 2nd semester, students will study American music in the 1800's and 1900's including jazz, blues, and swing music. Students will also be introduced to the foundational musical concepts of notation, rhythm, pitch, form, and melody to give a fuller understanding of the inner workings of the pieces and of music in general.
